¹⁴ and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ lesus

¹⁵ The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost.

¹⁶ But I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display his perfect patience as an example to those who were to believe in him for eternal life.

Psalm 103:8-17

- ⁸ The Lord is **compassionate** and **gracious**, Slow to anger and **abounding in lovingkindness**.
- ⁹ He will not always strive with us, Nor will He keep His anger forever.
- ¹⁰ He has not dealt with us according to our sins, Nor rewarded us according to our iniquities.
- ¹¹ For as high as the heavens are above the earth, So great is His lovingkindness toward those who fear Him.
- ¹² As far as the east is from the west, So far has He removed our transgressions from us.
- ¹³ Just as a father has compassion on *his* children, So the Lord has **compassion** on those who fear Him.
- ¹⁴ For He Himself knows our frame; He is mindful that we are *but* dust.

→ God is FAITHFFUL

GOD is faithful

1Cor. 1:9; 10:13; 1Tim. 1:15 Heb. 10:23; 1John 1:9

God is FAITHFUL – an oft repeated statement, but one also that is exemplified over and over throughout the Bible..

1 Corinthians 1:9 God is faithful, through whom you were called into fellowship with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

1 Corinthians 10:13 No temptation has overtaken you but such as is common to man; and God is faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will provide the way of escape also, so that you will be able to endure it.

1 Timothy 1:15 It is a trustworthy statement, deserving full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, among whom I am foremost *of all*.

Hebrews 10:23 Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful;

Hebrews 11:11 By faith even Sarah herself received ability to conceive, even beyond the proper time of life, since she considered Him faithful who had promised.

And of course: 1 John 1:9 If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

→ IF forgiven, Why don't I 'feel like it' -

If I am forgiven, why don't I 'feel like it'?

If I am forgiven, why don't I 'feel like it' --

The old problem of 'feelings' as 'evidence of truth' – Feelings tell you how you FEEL...

Multiple reasons why you may feel that way.. And all could be wrong!

→ Problem with forgiveness – some things it doesn't do!

Forgiveness DOESN'T

- Remove all consequences
- Remove knowledge / memory

Forgiveness DOESN'T

Doesn't Undo ALL consequences -

WHILE it does save from wrath / judgment against those sins – many consequences will remain – temporal, relational, financial, social, etc.

Doesn't remove KNOWLEDGE and MEMORY – either in US or in OTHERSPaul remembered his SINS...

We NEED such to motivate to NOT do again, to remind how awful sin is...

→ God promised, have I done what HE SAID?

Have I DONE what God said?

Acts 2:38-39; 8:20-23 1John 1:8-10

Problem here is two-fold Have I done what God asked (

Acts 2:38-39 - know assuredly (36), repent, baptized - forgiven Acts 8:20-23; 1John 1:8-10)

→ THEN deal with conscience



Dealing with conscience -

A great gift from God ... part of our moral being.

The ability to sit in judgment upon SELF -

The motivator of most change in our lives...

In Acts 2 -- 'they were pricked in their heart' – their conscience declared them GUILTY!

→ HOW Does this work?

Conscience is TRAINED – it sits in judgment ACCORDING to its (my) knowledge. Some, poorly knowing, excuse what is condemned! Some, also lacking good knowledge, condemn what is excused. Here, is condemning in self what has been forgiven.

Dealing with conscience -

i.e., Paul persecuted the church 'in all good conscience'. Acts 23:1

Others have seared their conscience (1Tim. 4:2)

Titus 1:15 To the pure, all things are pure; but to those who are defiled and unbelieving, nothing is pure, but both their mind and their conscience are defiled. Some, also lacking good knowledge, condemn what is excused.

Here, is condemning in self what has been forgiven.
