 - God's place in men's hearts was restored. 2 Chronicles 31:1b

- Principles for Restoration:
 - 1. Restoration begins with going back to the source, the Bible.
 - 2. Restoration is sustained when I desire to do *only* God's will.
 - 3. Restoration is not satisfied with good enough or close enough.
 - 4. Restoration is not complete until all hindrances and idols are removed.

- Some Final Observations:
 - Restoration not reformation.2 Timothy 3:16-17; 2 Peter 3:1
 - To restore is to go back to the original.
 (John 16:13; Jeremiah 6:16)
 - Restoration is possible because God did not leave us without the truth (John 8:32).
 - The only right decision to make when we are on the wrong path is to go back to the right path.
