- The Meaning of the Word "Amen."
  - A transliterated word from Hebrew into Greek and English.
  - Dictionaries:
    - •Mounce's Complete Expository Dictionary of Old and New Testament Words, "to show oneself dependable, know oneself to be secure, have faith." In general amēn means "certain[ly]" or "true[ly].
    - Easton's Bible Dictionary, "This Hebrew word means firm, and hence also faithful (Rev. 3:14).

- The Meaning of the Word "Amen."
  - Dictionaries:
    - Vines, "Thus 'Amen' said by God 'it is and shall be so, 'and by men, 'so let it be.'
  - "Amen" carries different emphasis depending on placement.
    - Beginning of a discourse, "Truly I say to you..."
      Matt. 5:18; Mk. 3:28
    - At the close of a sentence, "So it is, so be it, may it be fulfilled." Matt. 28:20

- The Meaning of the Word "Amen."
  - "Amen" carries different emphasis depending on placement.
    - When used as an adjective, "Firm" or "true." Deut. 7:9; Isa. 65:16
    - •After another's statement or prayer, "This is true," "may it come to pass," or "we agree." 1 Chron. 16:35-36; Ps. 106:48

- The Usage of the Word "Amen."
  - To express agreement or affirmation. Deut. 27:14-26
  - To endorse prayer. Rom. 11:36
  - To express the truthfulness of an inspired writing.
     Rom. 16:27; 1 Cor. 16:24
  - To express agreement at the end of the reading of Scripture.
     Neh. 8:6
  - Used by Jesus to emphasize His authority. John 3:3, 5; 5:24-25

- Why Does This Matter?
  - 1. Word studies help us discover the concepts and ideas the Bible writers had in mind when they chose the words they did.
  - 2. Meaning of words change over time. Ex. 2 Tim. 3:17 NASB.
  - 3. Word studies help us to accurately handle the word of God. 2 Tim. 2:15 NASB.
